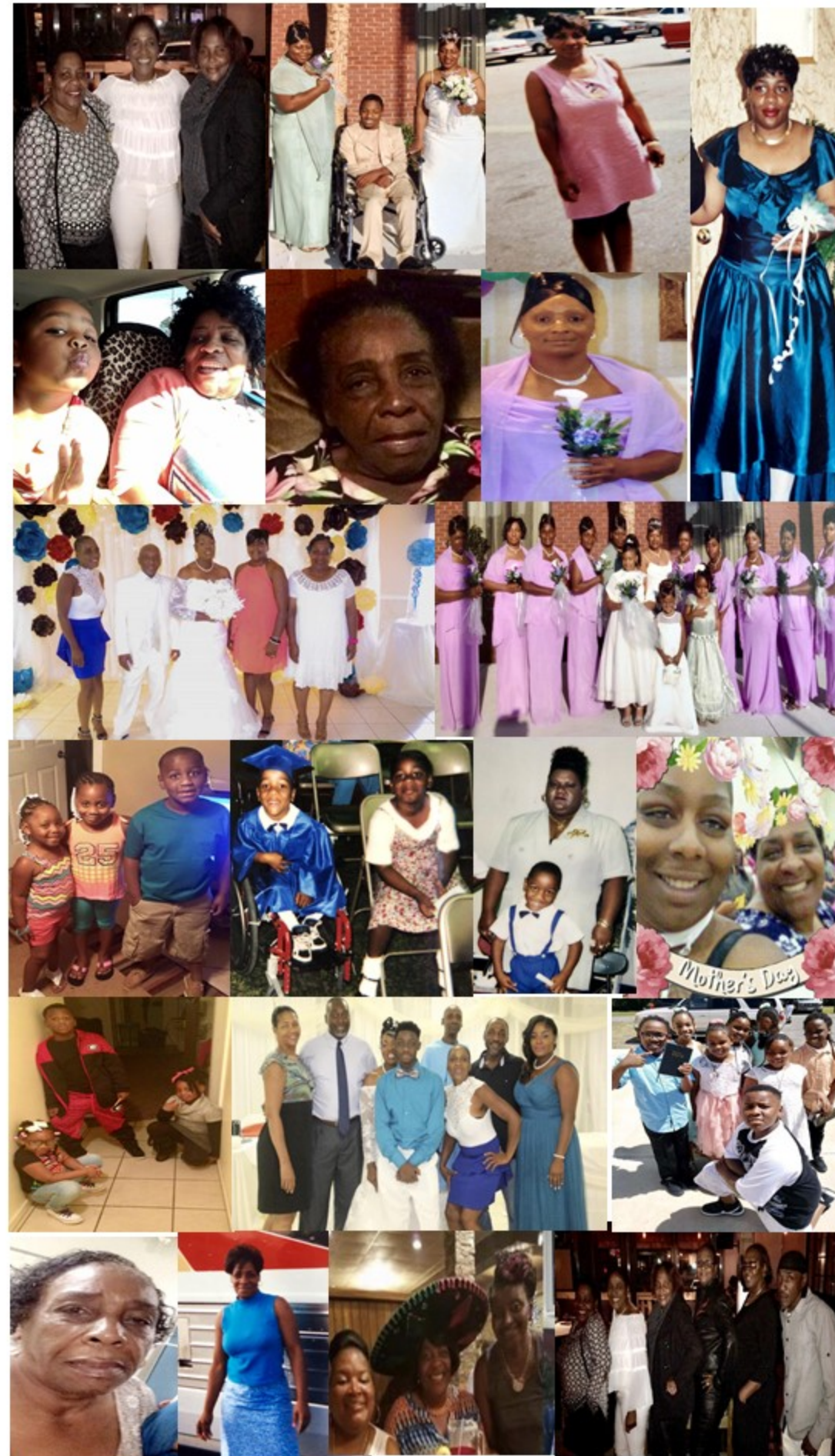
Precious Memories...
