

It is with profound sadness that The Paulk Family conveys the glorious transition of Deacon Albert Paulk, Jr. President of the Men's Department at Hightower Memorial Temple House of God Saints in Christ, Inc., Deacon Board and a #1 Member. Deacon Paulk's triumphant on Thursday, culminates a distinguished Journey dedicated to the service of the Lord.
