Adell Jones, Jr., the seventh child of ten (10) children, was born on May 18, 1948, in Broxton, Georgia, to the late Mr. Adell Jones, Sr., and the late Mrs. Ida Mae Fields Jones.

After living in Miami, Florida, during his early childhood for a few years, the Jones family moved back to Broxton, Georgia, in 1960 when he was around 12 years old. He attended Carver High School in Douglas, Coffee County, Georgia, and in April 1968, Adell was drafted into the U.S. Army.

Adell, a veteran of the Vietnam War, served in Vietnam from December 1968 to December 1969. He was a very outstanding serviceman and was honorably discharged. He received honor by a grateful nation for his meritorious service to his country in time of war. He was a recipient of the National Defense Service Medal; Vietnam Service Medal with two Bronze Service Stars; Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal; Expert (Rifle).

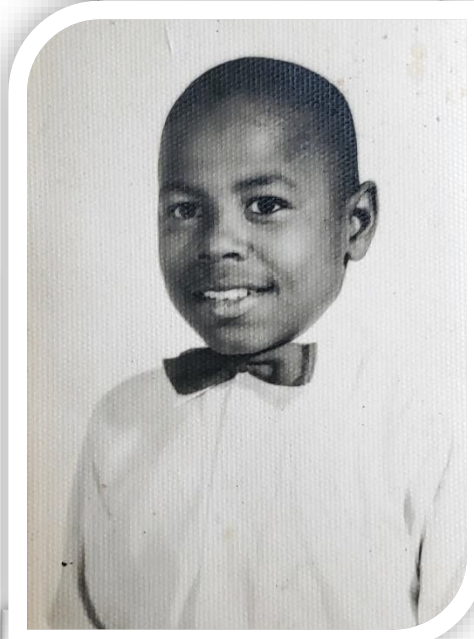
