Minister Sollie Solomon, Jr. was the 2nd oldest child born to the late Sollie Solomon, Sr. and Mattie Moore Solomon on April 13, 1949, in McRae, Georgia. He received his education from Carver High and Elementary School, Douglas, Georgia. He later attended Roosevelt Warm Springs Vocational Training School in Warm Springs, Georgia, where he took up mechanics as a trade.

He was a member of Broxton Deliverance Center, Broxton, Georgia, under the leadership of Pastor George Wilkerson. He was ordained as Minister of the Gospel under the late Chief Apostle Charles Wilkerson, Sr. He was a faithful and supportive member fulfilling all of his duties to the best of his ability. He loved his church and his leaders, and he made himself available to serve wherever he could. He loved Sunday School and was excited about going to the house of the Lord, where he knew he would receive something to help him on this journey. You may not have seen him immediately when you went to church, but soon you would hear him with his "shaker," which he created.
