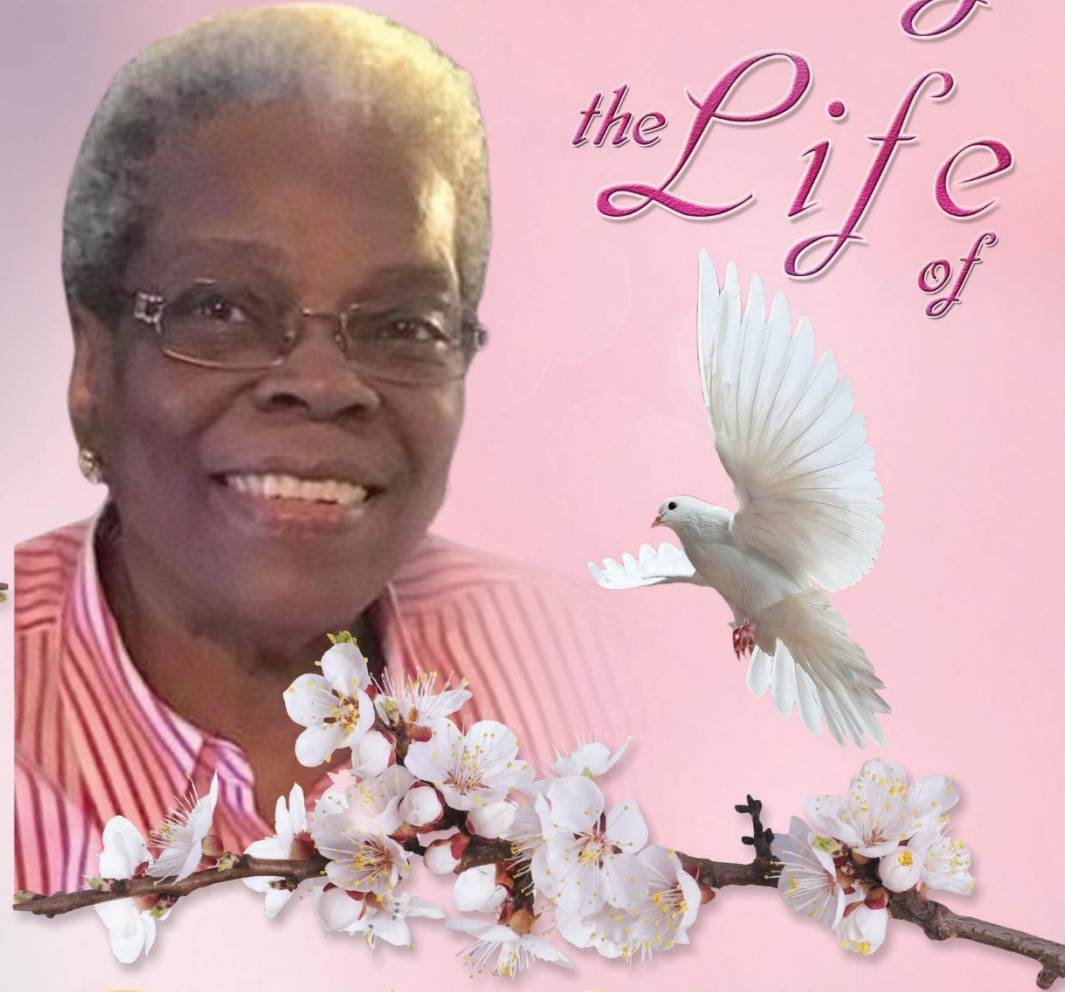

Doretha Williams was born to the late Frank and Minnie Williams on May 10, 1930, in Ocilla, Georgia. She was raised by her late stepfather Marshal Ashley.

At an early age, she attended St. John Missionary Baptist Church in Wray, Georgia. Later in life, studying and discussing with Hattie Marshall, Doretha became a faithful member of the Church of Christ in Coconut Grove, Florida.
