One daughter, Angela Parker, preceded him in death. He attended the Kight's Elementary School and Mary Hayes Elementary School in Coffee County, Broxton, Georgia. He also attended George Washington Carver High School, Douglas, Georgia. He never attended culinary school, but he could cook up a meal worth eating. He was a hard and swift worker. He was an avid gardener and loved seeing things grow. James loved people, always willing to lend a helping hand to those in need. He was a logger, and he shared the ownership of Pace logging Company. He employed several men around the Coffee County area.


At an early age he joined the Broxton Deliverance Center under the leadership of the late Apostle Charles Wilkerson, Sr. On several youth Sundays Apostle Wilkerson would have him read Malichi 3:8. Like Moses he couldn't speak affluent which we called "tied tongue".
