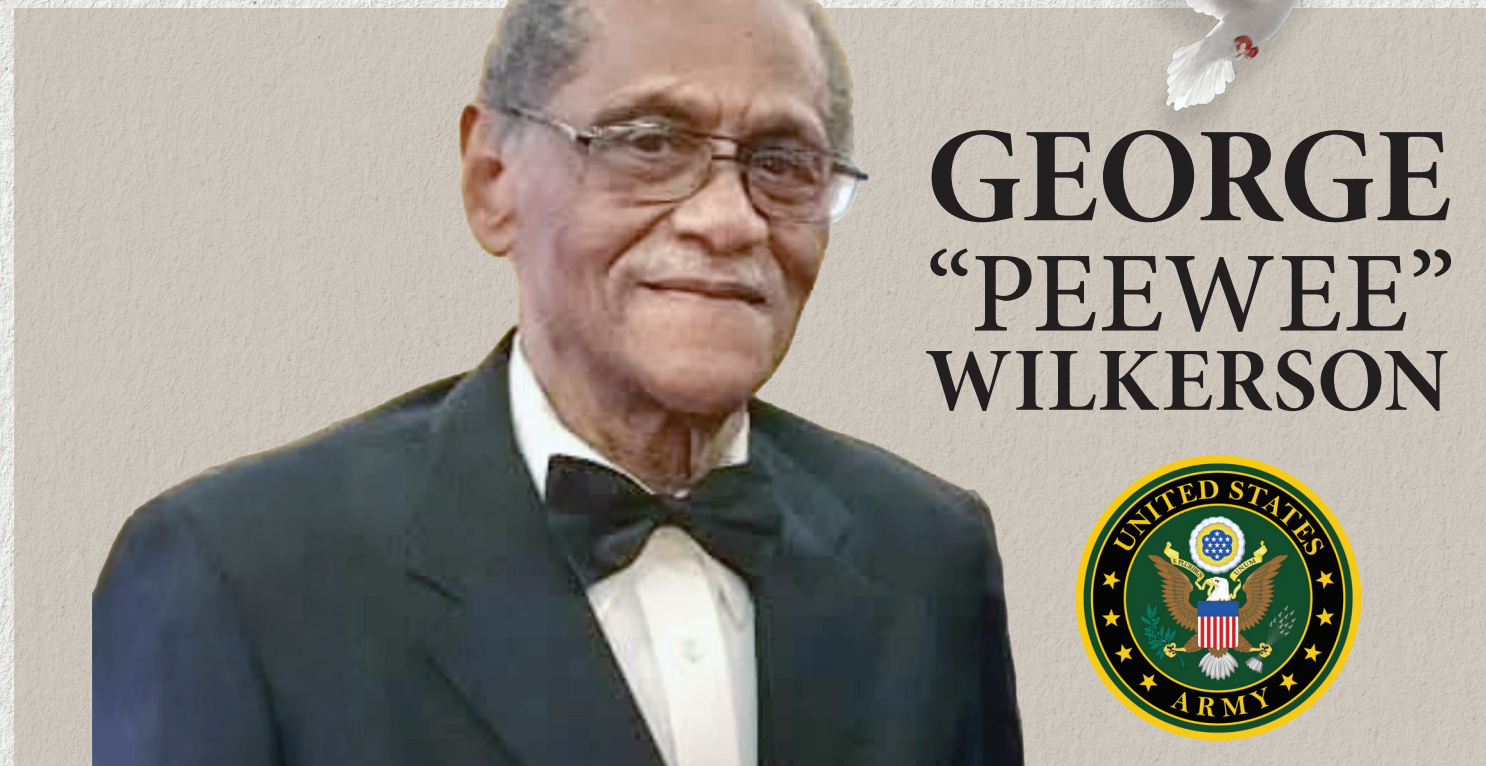

Mr. George Wilkerson, affectionately known as “PeeWee” by his beloved grandchildren, was born on July 8, 1933, in Douglas, Georgia, to the late Robert and Leola Wilkerson. The youngest of seven children, he was preceded in death by his siblings, Johnny Robert, Mable, Ruby Lee, Lillian, Apostle Charles, and James Wilkerson.

Mr. Wilkerson attended Carver High School and continued his education at Savannah State University. A man of deep faith, he was a devoted Christian and a longtime member of Deliverance Evangelistic Centers (DEC) of Georgia, Incorporated. He served as Pastor of the Broxton Deliverance Center until his health began to decline.

On April 1, 1960, Mr. Wilkerson answered the call to serve his country by enlisting in the United States Army during the Korean War. He was honorably discharged on April 2, 1962, after earning numerous awards that reflected his unwavering dedication and exemplary service to the highest traditions of the U.S. Army.

Following his military service, Mr. Wilkerson built a successful career as an Inspector with the Federal and State Departments of Agriculture, where he dedicated over 30 years of diligent service.
