His Life Story

We pause today to celebrate the life and legacy of one of God’s faithful servants, Feallon Rease, affectionately known as “Felton” or “Slim.” He was born on December 28, 1940, to the proud parents Mr. Lester and Mrs. Willie Mae Eady Rease. Felton was the second oldest of ten siblings.

He began his early education at Carver High School. After the passing of his father and as his older brother was drafted into the Army, Felton stepped into the role of being the man of the house, a responsibility he carried with strength and dedication. From there, he began a long and admirable work career.

Felton was a committed and hardworking man. He was employed with Gold Kist, Golden Poultry, and Lott’s Builders, where he worked diligently for over 44 years, never missing a single day of work. His work ethic was unmatched, and his devotion to providing for his family left a lasting impression on all who knew him.
