Tony "TJ" Lee Bright Jr. of Douglas, Georgia, passed away on December 9, 2025. Born on February 8, 1993, to Tony Lee Bright Sr. and Quiwana Bright, Tony was the youngest of three children and a beloved son, brother, husband, father, and friend.

The youngest of three, Tony perfected the art of being the baby who was protected, adored, and occasionally spoiled by his parents and grandparents. Raised in Douglas, he stayed active in school athletics, wrestling and playing football; and he was a proud fan of the Atlanta Falcons. A true competitor at heart, he carried that same fire into gaming. In high school he balanced the mat, the field, and the controller, dominating NBA 2K, running through opponents in Madden, and talking confident smack in Mortal Kombat.
