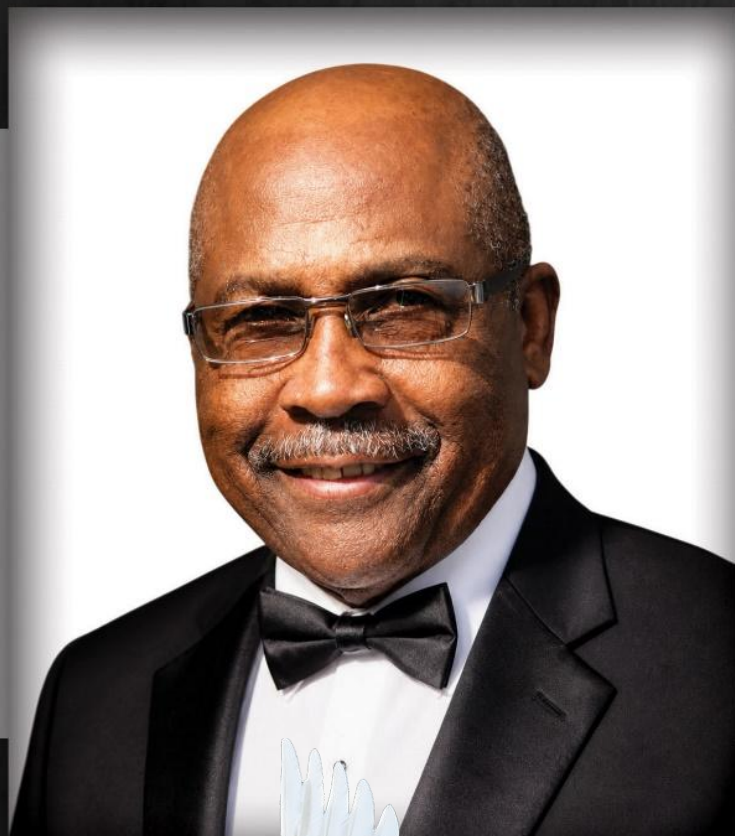

Bishop Albert O'Neal Wimbley was born on May 14, 1948, to the late Evangelist Verna McRae-Sims and the late Prophet O'Neal Wimbley. On Monday, May 4, 2026, he peacefully transitioned from this earthly life into eternal rest with his Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Bishop Wimbley received his education at George Washington Carver High School, where he developed a love for athletics and went on to enjoy playing semi-professional football in his early years. Throughout his life, he embraced simple joys and meaningful pastimes, finding great pleasure in golfing, football, pool, and bowling.

A hardworking and dedicated man, Bishop Wimbley was a skilled truck driver who faithfully served alongside his father in their family business, Wimbley Logging Inc. He also contributed his talents to Wooten Transport of Hazlehurst and P&M Trucking. His work ethic and commitment to providing for his family were evident in all that he did.

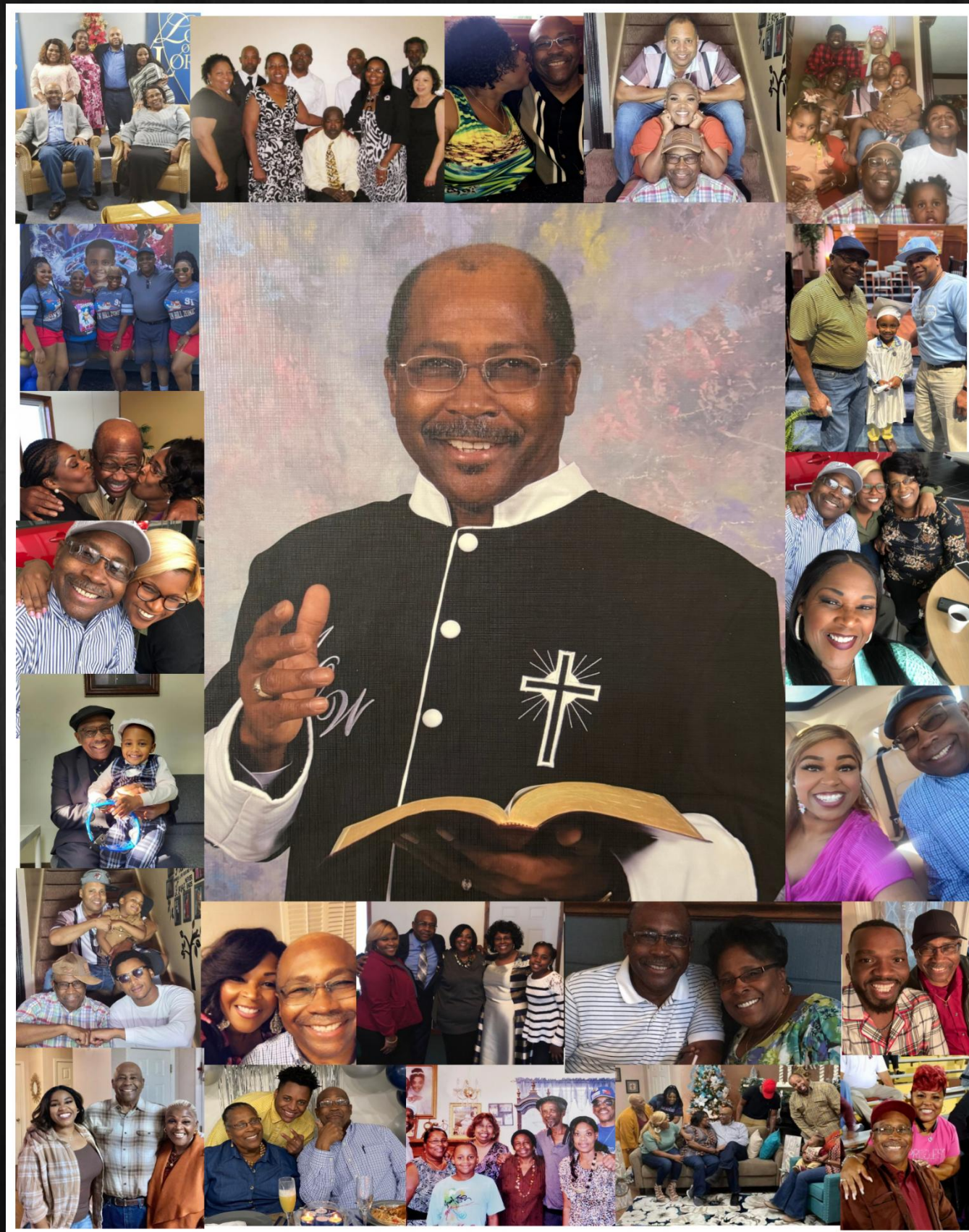
